#### **FISHING REPORT**

## The following January 1 Facebook post by Jeremy Scott tells the whole story:

Fishing remains excellent in Presque Isle Bay. My best advice is to get out and drive around. Fish a spot for five to ten minutes and pay attention to what others are doing. Are they catching fish, are the fish the species you're after, are they of the size you're after? How are they fishing, what are they using and how? If no keepers in ten minutes then either switch tactics or spots because the Fall feeding frenzy is still on! The two main locations have been 3 to 10 foot weed beds targeting fishing honing in on baby bluegills and the deep water 15 to 30 foot fish. Where you need to fish on the bottom, I have been after the shallow fish using 4 lb mono w/ fluorocarbon leader, rocket bobber to detect the subtle cold water bites and a silver trout magnet head with either White, Chartreuse power worm chunk tipped w/ two maggots or a Bobby Garland Bitty B plastic. Happy New Year!

(Note: Jeremy Scott is an avid outdoorsman who has shared his expertise with our members many times as a speaker at our meetings)



The mild weather has afforded some great fishing opportunities as evident in recent posts on the Presque Isle Bay Anglers Facebook page.



#### **DUCK HUNTERS PITCH IN**

The duck hunters mentioned in the post on the left were Tom Mascharka (at the skiff tiller) and his son, Tom Jr, They were coming off the Lake after duck hunting into the channel at Walnut Creek and as they entered the mouth of the creek the shore fishermen started to reel in their lines as required when the fisherman who identifies as FISHWESTPA# hooked a steelhead which swam under their stopped boat entangling the line. Tom and his son offered to net the fish which they did and released it. This story causes us to reflect on the fact that the origin of our club is deeply rooted in the NW PA Duck Hunters Assoc. In 1981 a group of good friends were attending a graduation party when the conversation went to the poor condition of the Lake Erie fishery. They decided that forming an organization to work to improve fishing and the fishery was in order- The SONS of Lake Erie was born. Almost all of these men were members of the NW PA Duck Hunters Assoc. and a lot of the structure of the duck club which was formed in 1958 were incorporated into the SONS. Many of these men served as our first officers and directors.





#### THE PROGRAM AT OUR DECEMBER MEETING

was a presentation by WQLN TV producer director Mike Berlin. He brought with him the video of an episode of the WQLN "Chronicle" series which spotlights areas of the history of the Erie Region. The half hour video was entitled "Lake Science". The presentation gave us a look at the historic geology of Lake Erie. The program begins with great description of how the Great Lakes were formed 15,000 years ago by Harvey Webster from the Cleveland Museum of Natural History. It also featured interviews with Dr. Jeanette Schnarrs, director of the Regional Science Consortium, Bob Wellington former Aquatic Biologist from the Erie County Health Dept. They outlined the historic biological changes to the waters of Lake Erie and the watershed. WJET Meteorologist, Tom DiVecchio talked about the relation of Lake Erie to our local climate. Mark Haffley, team leader from the PFBC Lake Erie research unit talked about the Lake Erie fishery. There was also historical photos and video clips highlighting Presque Isle State park. SONS president Jerry Skrypzak talked about the history of Erie's commercial fishing industry. The video was extremely well done. 

They will give a rough idea of what the camera captures- #1 is the boat launch ramp, #2 is the parking lot, #3 is the basin area, #4 is the creek retaining wall, #5 is the mouth of Walnut Cr. and #6 is a view of Lake Erie. We hope to afford viewers a view od the fishing activity, weather and lake

conditions. The scenes will be adjusted to fit the seasonal activities. We are pleased with the image quality and are grateful to have FishUSA as a partner and the grant we received from the PFBC. #### **PFBC GATHER STEELHEAD FOR SPAWNING**

On December 12, 2023 a team of PFBC Hatchery staff and biologists, youths from the Governor's Youth Council as well as a host of onlookers gathered in and around the mouth of Trout Run while helpers in waders netted hundreds of steelhead which were sorted by sex and then taken into the small building on the beach (we showed it last month) where eggs and spawn were harvested. The fish were loaded into PFBC trucks were they were taken to be released elsewhere. This scenario is repeated frequently and is really cool to watch.

#### **GREAT LAKES BRIEFS:**

**The water level of most of the Great Lakes** has been falling. According to NOAA lower water level reduces the threat of beach erosion and coast flooding during windy winter storms.

**The level of Lake Erie** is down 2" in the last month, but it's up 4" in the last year. It stands 9" above the December average, but is 26" below the highest December level that occurred in 1986.

**The Great Lakes had the smallest amount of ice cover** this New Year's Day in at least the past 50 years. The Lakes are on track to see less ice cover than the seasonal average this winter, according to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's Great Lakes Environmental Research Laboratory.

**FYI** According to the North East Township Community Calendar, a public hearing will be held on Wednesday, January 24, at 6:00 PM at the North East High School auditorium regarding the North East Marina.

#### THE ANNUAL FRUIT BASKET DISTRIBUTION

was completed on Saturday December 9th by members of the PA Steelhead Association, S.O.N.S. of Lake Erie, 3.C.U. Trout Association, TU, and Gem City Outdoorsman's club and many others who volunteered their time delivering fruit baskets to landowners that allow public fishing access along their stretches of Steel-head streams. 92 baskets were distributed. The fruit basket program has been in place since the 1990s. Landowner relations are essential to maintain fishing access along the Erie Steelhead streams — there are miles of property that are available for fishing thanks to land-owner permission. Please treat all property with respect but be especially gracious when fishing private property open to the public; stick to clear paths, read and follow all signage.

#### SOME THOUGHTS ABOUT ICE FISHING

Weather forecasts are predicting some very cold weather which could possibly generate enough ice for fishing. One thing that you should always remember that ice should never be considered safe and early season ice conditions vary from waterbody to waterbody.

There is no agency that monitor ice conditions, making it the individuals' responsibility to learn those conditions. The ice conditions on any lake can vary from location to location. Remember, even though it may look thick on the surface, moving water from streams, rivers and springs can cause ice to form unevenly Remember use care and check ice conditions yourself do not rely on hearsay.

People who do venture out on the ice should:

• Dress warmly in layers and consider wearing a life jacket or vest.

• Do Not go alone. Head out with friends or family. Take a cell phone and make sure someone knows where you are and when you are expected to return.

• Know before you go. Don't travel in areas you are not familiar and don't travel at night or during reduced visibility.

• Avoid inlets, outlets or narrows that may have current that can thin the ice.

• Look for clear ice, which is generally stronger than ice with snow on it or bubbles in it.

• Carry some basic safety gear: ice claws or picks, a cellphone in a waterproof bag or case, a life jacket and length of rope, and a spud bar to check ice while walking to new areas.

• Wear creepers attached to boots to prevent slipping on ice and take extra mittens or gloves so you always have a dry pair.




If you go through the ice:

• Carry a set of ice picks in your pocket to help you climb out of the ice hole.

• Once out of the water, do not stand up. Rather, walk on your forearms until the majority of your body is on solid surface.

• Try to remain calm, call for help and take steps to get out of the water as soon as possible.



#### PISP STAFF BUILD ACCESS POINTS FOR ICE FISHERMEN

Presque Isle State Park staff made access points for ice fisherman on Presque Isle Bay by pouring loads of gravel onto the riprap bordering Presque Isle Bay at Vista points 1, 3, 4 & 5. The gravel fills in the gaps of the rocks and should make it easier for ice fishermen to access the ice.



## REMINDER

A person shall wear a Coast Guard approved personal flotation device (PFD or life jacket) during the cold weather months from November 1st through April 30th while underway or at anchor on boats less than 16 feet in length or any canoe or kayak.
