#### FISHING REPORT

The ice never returned, leaving a lot of disappointed anglers, but being an adaptable bunch others soon hauled out their regular gear and began fishing from piers and docks as well as their boats. The Presque Isle Anglers Face book page has up to date entries by other fishermen providing details of both successes and failures. Our January program presenter, John Scherrer, posts regularly on Facebook. **John Scherrer posted the following:** 

March 3, 2024 – Pier fisherman had the advantage today. I can't imagine a boat being out in the wind and I didn't see any watercraft at all. I felt like Captain Dan standing in the shrimp boat in a hurricane... but... the fishing was fabulous as it often is when its rough and windy. Felt like I was fishing into a washing machine.

I kept the casts low and the line tight. High visibility line was a huge plus. Even though casting directly into the wind with waves and current I was able to stay with my 1/8-oz. drop-shot weight carrying the same Chartreuse/Pearl Case Li'l Fry bait that I used yesterday. I always use the lightest weight that just touches bottom. And keep the bait moving. Stop and go.

By the way, minnows or plastic? My bait cost 20¢ and I caught all my fish yesterday and today with it and likely the fishing trip or two before that. And I'll start with that same bait next time. That's well over 100 fish on the same bait. Quite the value! So that was a near limit yesterday and limit today and as many thrown back.

Boats are being utilized with increasing numbers. On Monday March 4th the Erie temperature reached a record high of 76 deg. with plenty of sunshine. At about 1pm I counted 20 boats on Misery Bay and sixteen more at the head of the bay. We sure are an adaptable brunch.

# COMPANIES PLEDGE TO UTILIZE ALL FISH PARTS

Fish-leather purses and wallets may make their way into Great Lakes fashion with an initiative to use 100% of commercially caught fish by 2025.

One of the latest projects of a binational Great Lakes organization is to fully use the region's whitefish, lake trout, yellow perch, walleye and white sucker.

The conference consists of leaders of eight states and two provinces bordering the Great Lakes. It was founded to grow the regional economy and protect the world's largest surface freshwater system.

According to the aricle there are food products you can make out of non-traditional parts of the fish. Commercially caught fish are used primarily for their fillets, about 60% of the remaining fish becomes low-value animal feed or is discarded.

Commercial Great Lakes fishing is a \$7 billion-a-year industry.

### MEMBERSHIP LEVEL IS STILL LAGGING

Our annual membership drive was launched earlier last fall and as of the end of February the level was at 2100, well below last year. We need your help to solicit more members to reach our goal of 2600.



Using 100% of commercially caught fish means expanding and sustaining an already profitable lake economy and culture. The pledge details how a fish can be turned into products, increasing profits and eliminating waste.

Fish skin can be turned into leather and artistic materials. Collagen can be used as pharmaceutical supplements. Oils and collagen can be used in cosmetics and creams.

Fish skins have been used to treat burn victims because of their anti-inflammatory and anti-bacterial properties that support and improve wound healing. Nutrients from their flesh and bones can be turned into medications and collagen beverages.

Anything leftover can be turned into organic liquid fertilizer which is where the carcasses from our fish cleaning stations are taken by an Ohio based collector.

### SHASTA RAINBOW TROUT TO BE STOCKED IN LAKE ERIE TRIBS

The following was posted on Facebook by Paul Olszewski:

On Friday, March 1st, members of several fishing organizations (3-CU, PA Steelhead Association, SONS of Lake Erie, Gem City Fly Tiers, and Northwest Pennsylvania Chapter of Trout Unlimited) along with Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission personnel, clipped the fins on approximately 15,000 Shasta Rainbow Trout at the 3-CU Mitchell Raceway near Lake City. These fish were placed in the raceway during the summer and will be released into one of the Pennsylvania tributaries draining into Lake Erie in the next few weeks. In 2 to 3 years, these Shasta Rainbows should be returning to our tributaries to spawn. By fin-clipping these fish we hope to get an idea on how well they imprint on our streams and return to them at that time.

The fish are netted up and placed into tubs of water containing an anesthetic for fish. The fish slow down in 2-3 minutes and their bellies turn upward. They are gently picked up and the adipose fin (that small fin on the back that is in front of the tail) is snipped off with small scissors and the fish are placed back into the water. Within 15 minutes they make a full recovery and swim about normally.

On Wednesday, February 28th, a similar group of people with the addition of an employee from Tudor Hook-n-Nook, finclipped 13,000 Shasta Rainbows at 3-CU's Ro-Zee Raceway. Conditions were pretty miserable that day as the raceway water was off-color after the rain the night before and a front went through while the crew was working bringing ferocious winds and a big temperature drop. Despite all of this the crew got things done.

A BIG thank you to everyone who helped with these projects

A Little Background---- Shasta Rainbows are native to Lake Shasta in northern California. The lake was created by the Shasta Dam which blocks the northern end of the Sacramento

River. The dam is 602 ft high and is a complete barrier to fish migration. It creates a freshwater impoundment with a surface area of 29,740 acres. Shasta Rainbows behave like other rainbow trout as they spawn in the Spring, but they run up into tributary creeks and rivers Fall through Spring. Unlike Pacific Coast steelhead which are anadromous (hatch and mature in freshwater, live several years in saltwater, and return to freshwater to spawn); Shasta Rainbows live their entire life in freshwater.




