

FISHING REPORT

Facebook posts by anglers show that perch and walleye are being caught. Steelhead fishing has ramped up, but lack of rain until now, is preventing the fish from moving upstream due to the low water levels. A real problem arose when a sand bar formed in Trout Run causing the fish to beach themselves and die. PFBC workers cleaned up the dead steelhead and installed a fence around the sand bar to keep from stranding themselves.

The low water has not discouraged anglers from trying, as shown in this drone photo taken on October 19, 2024 by Terry Hosack. It shows 41 fishermen lined up at Avonia Beach at the mouth of Trout Run. Notice the darker patches in the water in front of the fishermen. Those are shadows of schools of Steelhead. FISH COMMISSION OFFERS AMENDMENT TO 2X2 SKIN RULE

PA Fish and Boat Commissioners voted to approve the publication of a notice of proposed rulemaking pertaining to regulations for fish cleaning stations (58 Pa. Code § 63.15a). Following comments from the public regarding the current requirement to leave a 2-inch by 2-inch piece of skin on processed fillets at noncommercial officially recognized fish cleaning stations, PFBC staff conducted a review that included internal discussions, a meeting in Erie in September with interested stakeholders to hear and discuss their feedback, and consideration at two Law Enforcement Committee meetings. As a result of this process, staff determined that resource conservation goals could be achieved by eliminating the 2-inch by 2-inch piece of skin requirement in favor of requiring that fillets remain fully intact. If adopted on final rulemaking at a future meeting, the amendments will go into effect upon publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.

The news release leaves a question that must be addressed. Does it mean that the skin must remain on the fish for the fillet to be fully intact? That needs to be clarified.


NOMINATIONS FOR SONS OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS

REMINDER-MANDATORY LIFE JACKETS REQUIRED

November 1 through April 30

In 2012, this regulation was established: a person shall wear a Coast Guard approved personal flotation device (PFD or life jacket) during the cold weather months from November 1st through April 30th while underway or at anchor on boats less than 16 feet in length or any canoe or kayak.

PFBC FISH CULTURISTS READY TO SPAWN STEELHEAD

A small building has been moved onto Avonia Beach in preparation for fish culturists to take eggs and spawn from steelhead congregated in Trout Run. The building will be used to complete the egg and spawn gathering. In the past the fish were taken from the creek and transported to the PFBC Fish Cultural Station located on Rt. 5 near Rt. 98 for spawning and some of the fertilized eggs were sent to the Tionesta culture station for hatching and rearing while others were kept in Fairview. As reported last month the eggs are no longer permitted to be transported out of the Great Lakes watershed in order to prevent the spread of the invasive VHS virus. Now after the eggs are fertilized they will be transported to PFBC's Fish Culture Station for hatching where they will be held until they become large enough to stock. The Fairview station has a capacity to handle about 500,000 fish and plans are to modify the facility to accommodate more.

The brood fish will be released into streams and fishable areas throughout the Lake Erie watershed.

The egg gathering process will begin soon and fun to watch. The activity usually extends into December. When we find out the schedule for the spawning we will let you know.



LAMPE MARINA WEB CAMERA

As reported last month the Lampe web camera is now up and running. It is being provided through a partnership of the Erie Western PA Port Authority, Fish USA and the SONS of Lake Erie. The Lampe web cam is on top of a pole alongside of the boat launch and pans 360 deg. showing the marina entrance, launch ramp fish cleaning station and parking lot and points out into the lake. It can be set for different views by zooming the lens in and out. It will be in operation throughout the winter. You can watch contractors at work installing new piers.



Heavy equipment from Lake Shore, the General Contractor is already in place to begin the multi-million dollar dock replacement project at Lampe Marina.





TROUT RUN - AVONIA BEACH, A FALL DESTINATION

If you're looking for a neat thing to do in the fall, take a ride to Avonia Beach located at the mouth of Trout Run at the northern end of Route 98 in Fairview Township, PA. This beautiful public area on Lake Erie has about a 150 yards of sandy beach, parking for about 50 cars, porta potties and easy walking. The PFBC has declared Trout Run nursery waters so it is closed for fishing, however the shore along the beach is open for fishing. In the fall thousands of steelhead

gather in the lake an attempt to swim upstream to spawn. Their progress up stream is prohibited by a gate that has been installed to prevent passage. The water flowing over the top of the gate creates a waterfall of sorts and the determined steelhead try to swim up and over the barrier with no success. Fairview Township and the PFBC have built a public viewing area to watch the action unfold. It's cool to watch as shown by the amount of visitors to the site.






Photo on left shows a scout group gathered to watch the steelhead at Trout Run and the photo on the right shows steelhead trying to overcome the obstacle to spawning.
